2.2 - Catering to Student Diversity

Bangabasi Morning College is enriched with students with various type and levels of merit and intelligence. The faculty tries to furnish supplementary reference material like books, notes, some important articles, website link references, and e-book and laboratory facilities to advanced learners. Thorough these references all students get benefit greatly especially those from weak economic background. The faculty arranges for class quizzes, writing assignments on more challenging topics; further seminars or webinars widen their horizon through the learned inputs from distinguished resource persons. Besides, students are encouraged to give a demonstration of their understanding of a topic by speaking through PPT presentation, make a poster on a particular topic, asking questions and participating in quiz competition. We encourage the students to know about Politics, sports, General knowledge etc. Through a mentor-mentee system also all kind of support are provided to slow learners.

Remedial classes are conducted for slow and weak learners so that they can catch up with the rest of the students. 2.5 - Evaluation Process and Reforms

2.5.1 - Mechanism of internal assessment is transparent and robust in terms of frequency and mode. Write description within 200 words.

As per CBCS guidelines and academic Calendar published by the University, the internal assessment examinations, i.e. Tutorial examination and internal examinations are undertaken. Concerning Tutorial examinations, few topics are given from the curriculum and the students can opt any one among according to their choice and preferences. For internal examinations, we frame objective type questions from the course. Each department enjoys the liberty to undertake internal examinations in such a way so that it caters the best interest of all the students' community. We come up with a blend of conceptual, theoretical, aesthetic and linguistic elements to carry out their internal assessments. We also follow interactive question answer sessions in the classes. For proper assessment in skill enhancement courses in our department of history, we have organised several educational tours to museums. We conduct class tests at regular intervals that have proved beneficial to the students' fraternity for preparation of examinations. The mode can be varied with speaking and listening skills tested periodically that may punctuate the more conventional mode of writing in an exam hall. The assignments given to the students are evaluated based on various cognitive processes like knowledge, Understanding, application, analysis, synthesis and evaluation.

INFRASTRUCTURE AND LEARNING RESOURCES

4.1 - Physical Facilities

4.1.1 - The Institution has adequate infrastructure and physical facilities for teaching- learning. viz., classrooms, laboratories, computing equipment etc.

The college has recently started teaching-learning activities in a newly-built exclusively-owned second campus, which is nearly 500 meters away from the main age-old campus. Despite the well-equipped and spacious classrooms and laboratories, sharing of the same oldcampus by three colleges (morning, day and evening) causes spaceconstraints in overlapping hours, which can be partly mitigated through vertical expansion of the building. New equipment needs to be procured in different laboratories to meet the demand of evolving syllabus. The college owns a continually-updated website, functioning as institutional database and repository of learning materials. Several departments including Principal's room, Professors' lounge, office have wi-fi connectivity, equipped with departmental laptops, printers, and projectors for audio-visual presentation. The college has Smart Classrooms and seminar halls fitted with LCD Projector and ICT facilities. The library has adequate numbers of text books, references, journals traceable through fully automated KOHA Software. A well-maintained canteen at the backyard of college. There are three diesel-run generators at the ground and solar panels installed in the roof. Recently a fund from MP Grant has been released for construction of two lifts in the old campus.

As per CBCS guidelines and academic Calendar published by the University, the internal assessment examinations, i.e. Tutorial examination and internal examinations are undertaken. Concerning Tutorial examinations, few topics are given from the curriculum and the students can opt any one among according to their choice and preferences. For internal examinations, we frame objective type questions from the course. Each department enjoys the liberty to undertake internal examinations in such a way so that it caters the best interest of all the students' community. We come up with a blend of conceptual, theoretical, aesthetic and linguistic elements to carry out their internal assessments. We also follow interactive question answer sessions in the classes. For proper assessment in skill enhancement courses in our department of history, we have organised several educational tours to museums. We conduct class tests at regular intervals that have proved beneficial to the students' fraternity for preparation of examinations. The mode can be varied with speaking and listening skills tested periodically that may punctuate the more conventional mode of writing in an exam hall. The assignments given to the students are evaluated based on various cognitive processes like knowledge, Understanding, application, analysis, synthesis and evaluation.

4.1 - Physical Facilities

4.1.1 - The Institution has adequate infrastructure and physical facilities for teaching-learning. viz., classrooms, laboratories, computing equipment etc.

The college has recently started teaching-learning activities in a newly-built exclusively-owned second campus, which is nearly 500 meters away from the main age-old campus. Despite the well-equipped and spacious classrooms and laboratories, sharing of the same old-campus by three colleges (morning, day and evening) causes space-constraints in overlapping hours, which can be

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partly mitigated through vertical expansion of the building. New equipment needs to be procured in different laboratories to meet the demand of evolving syllabus. The college owns a continually-updated website, functioning as institutional database and repository of learning materials. Several departments including Principal's room, Professors' lounge, office have wi-fi connectivity, equipped with departmental laptops, printers, and projectors for audio-visual presentation. The college has Smart Classrooms and seminar halls fitted with LCD Projector and ICT facilities. The library has adequate numbers of text books, references, journals traceable through fully automated KOHA Software. A well-maintained canteen at the backyard of college. There are three diesel-run generators at the ground and solar panels installed in the roof. Recently a fund from MP Grant has been released for construction of two lifts in the old campus.

As our college is situated in the heart of the city with a bustling marketplace nearby, maintaining cleanliness on campus is crucial. On 30th September 2023, the N.C.C. unit of the college celebrated Swachh Bharat Diwas in advance. The students conducted a cleanliness programme on the college campus as well as the surrounding marketplace. Dustbins for biodegradable and nonbiodegradable wastes are placed at different corners of the building. Every morning the sweeping staff take away the garbage and dump them to the KMC dustbins. They also take care of the garbage accumulated during college time. Dusting and cleaning of toilets are done daily. All drainage pipes from the toilets, as well as the facilities (laboratory and staff rooms) with basins, are ended to meet the KMC drain. College premises are regularly visited by assigned plumbers, so that, any sort of water drainage related is resolved as early as possible. The college does not produce any radioactive waste products. Various electronic wastes are collected systematically and are recycled regularly following standard protocol.
